Purpose & Approach

- A Proposal Writing Camp (PWC) for Georgia will be organised in cooperation with the Horizon Europe Office Georgia with the purpose to provide a training on key elements of preparing Horizon Europe project proposals (Excellence, Impact, Implementation/work plan) for Georgian researchers and innovators.
- The PWC will be organised in the framework of the European Commission's Service Facility in support of the Global Approach in Research and Innovation.
- The PWC for Georgia will be held on site. A maximum of 30 participants will be accepted for the PWC. Per day of training the work will be limited to a maximum of 8 hours.
- The PWC will be split in overview presentations for all 30 participants, and group work in two groups with smaller number of participants. The trainers will guide and moderate the group work.
- Specific call topics of Horizon Europe will be used as example for drafting proposal parts.
- Specific attention will be given for MSCA.
